


Section 6. Should any section or provision hereof be judicially declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity hereof as a whole or any part hereof other than the part so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid; and the remaining provisions hereof shall be construed as if such invalid, unenforceable or unconstitutional provision or provisions had never been contained herein.

Section 7. All ordinances and resolutions or parts of ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 8. It is hereby found and determined that the City of Diamond City has no ordinances establishing or providing a fixed asset policy or uniform system of perpetual inventory of the City's property and equipment. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation and protection of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City, its property and its citizens, shall become effective on the date of its passage and approval by the Mayor. If the Ordinance is neither approved nor vetoed by the Mayor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Mayor may veto this Ordinance. If the Ordinance is vetoed by the Mayor and the veto is overridden by the City Council, it shall become effective on the date the City Council overrides the veto.
